The last time I occupied this chair was during our sesquicentennial, 150 years of Masonry in Reynoldsburg. Our friends from Whitehall Lodge helped us celebrate that special event. 

- 2. To each of you that has keep the building and administration of the lodge going through the year, I thank you. We even


- managed some improvements (see the Trustees' article later in the Trestleboard).

### **Trustees Report**

Your trustees continue to make improvements to the grounds and keep the building in good repair as the lodge returns to labor. While we were prevented from holding meetings from mid-March until late June, we were able to make some significant improvements to the Lancaster Avenue and Broadwyn Drive sides of the building. With the assistance of Big City Electric, owned by Bro. Dave Weber, we were able to greatly improve the lighting on the west side of the building and reduce the energy consumption by almost 70%.

With the assistance of WB Glenn Call and his son, Will along with PM Harold Davis and his wife Pamala, the Trustees added unobtrusive hostas to the landscaping. The old light boxes for the west side of the building were replaced with low voltage can lights that automatically turn on at dusk and off at dawn allowing our engraved stones to be viewed both day and night.

Please remember that when paying your annual dues, a donation to the Building Fund goes toward upgrading and maintaining our building and grounds. The Building Fund is used to improve the appearance and integrity of the building so that our members, guests and renters from the local Reynoldsburg area have an inviting location and building to meet. After establishing a tradition over the five previous years, Reynoldsburg Lodge will once again host the Reynoldsburg Community Association and home of Santa Claus during the upcoming Christmas on the Towne holiday event scheduled for Saturday, December 5, 2020. It is not clear whether the lodge will be able to offer food and drink to families coming to visit Santa Claus. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, it is likely the High School Band and Orchestra will not be performing in our lodge room this year. We will still have plenty of Christmas music in our lodge room and practice social distancing until this public health concern has passed.

As noted in previous issues, our daily rental rate of \$50 for members is one of the lowest around. Anyone who wishes to rent our building is asked to complete our Temporary User Agreement, which contains a check list to be completed when leaving the building. Contact a Trustee if you are interested in using our building for that holiday, birthday,

anniversary or retirement party. The more lead time that can be provided, the more likely the building will be available for your use.

As always, we remain dedicated to serve the Great Architect of the Universe, our Lodge brothers and their families.


