
May 9 is cancelled. Grand Lodge is discussing the possibility of rescheduling.

Trustees Report

Your trustees have been busy this past quarter. Using the proceeds from previous fundraising campaigns, we were able to replace our 31 year old furnace and air conditioner that services our kitchen and dining hall with a 90+% efficient 80,000 Btu/hr gas furnace and a 4 ton, 16 Seer air conditioner with a

remotely programmable thermostat. The work was performed on March 23rd and 24th. Pictures of the

furnace, condenser and thermostat are below.

Even with our new HVAC system, our daily rental rate of \$50 for members is one of the lowest in the area. Details on how to arrange

daily rentals for any family or community event can be found elsewhere in this issue of the Trestleboard. Anyone who wishes to rent our building is asked to complete our Temporary User Agreement, which contains a check list that must be completed when



leaving the building. Contact a Trustee if you are interested in using our building for that graduation, birthday or retirement party or family reunion. The more lead time that can be provided, the more likely the building will be available for your use.

'TIS NINE O'CLOCK HERE OR NINE O'CLOCK THERE.


WE TOAST TO ABSENT BRETHREN HERE AND THERE.
